<p><b>In Document B, 2.1 Delete:</b>            Emissions from the spray booths and automatic spray line shall be tested at least once a year for particulates to demonstrate compliance with clause 1.2.</p> <p><b>And Insert:</b>            Emissions from the spray booths and automatic spray line shall be tested at least once every two years for particulates to demonstrate compliance with clause 1.2.</p>	<p>Immediately</p>
<p><b>In Document B, 5.1 Delete:</b>            The operator shall undertake regular cleaning and preventative maintenance including inspection and repair/replacement on all plant and equipment concerned with the control of emissions to atmosphere. Where necessary manufacturers guidelines shall be used to determine the regularity of maintenance. Records of preventative maintenance including inspections and any works undertaken shall be kept on site and made available to the local authority inspector on request.</p> <p><b>And Insert:</b>            Effective preventative maintenance shall be employed on all aspects of the activity including all plant, and the equipment concerned with the control of emissions to air. In particular; a written maintenance programme shall be available to the regulator with respect to pollution control equipment and a record of such maintenance shall be made available for inspection by the regulator.</p>	<p>Immediately</p>
<p><b>In Document B, 5.3 Delete:</b>            Staff at all levels shall receive the necessary training and instruction in their duties relating to control of the activities and emissions to air. Records shall be kept</p>	<p>Immediately</p>

which details all relevant training provided to staff, and these records shall be kept for a minimum of 2 years.

**And Insert:**

5.3(i) The operator shall maintain a statement of the training requirements for each of the post and keep a record of the training received by each person whose actions may have an impact on the environment. These documents shall be made available to the regulator on request.

5.3(ii) The training of staff with Responsibility for operating the activity shall include:

- Awareness of their responsibilities under the Permit: in particular how to deal with conditions likely to give rise to emissions, such as in the event of spillage:
- Minimising emissions on the start up and shut down; and
- Action to minimise emissions.

**In Document B Insert New Clause 5.8:**

Operators shall put in place some form of structured environmental management system (EMS), whether by adopting published standards ISO14001 or the EU Eco Management and Audit Scheme [EMAS] or by setting up an EMS tailored to the nature and size of the particular process

**In Document B, 6.1 Delete:**

The operator shall identify products or materials that are/contain risk phased substances/materials R45, R46, R49, R60 and R61 and formulate and implement a timetable to replace, control and limit designated risk phase materials as soon as possible, as defined and agreed by the Local Authority.

The operator shall identify products or materials that are/contain risk phased substances/materials R40, R45, R49, R60 and R61 and formulate and implement a timetable to replace, control and limit designated risk phase materials as soon as possible, as defined and agreed by the
