HOW TO ENROL ON A COMMUNITY LEARNING CLASS

You can enrol from Tuesday 7 January 2025 by:

- Going online to coventry.gov.uk/adulted selecting 'Enrol Online for an Adult Education Course' and search for the course you would like to join.
- Calling **024 7697 5200** where a member of the Adult Education Service will enrol you onto a class. Payment can be made by debit or credit card only.
- There will be a Drop-In enrolment session on Tuesday 7 January for Community Learning courses at:

To avoid disappointment, we advise you enrol as early as possible.

COURSES THAT REQUIRE AN INTERVIEW

Courses requiring an interview/assessment are marked with an * throughout. You will be required to demonstrate skills to complete the qualification including written and verbal communication. Please see below for details on identity checks and fee exemptions. Details of how to enrol/book an assessment are in the following pages.

IMPORTANT – you must bring the following when you come to enrol for any of the courses marked with * below:

- Identification that will let us check if you are eligible for the course. Any one of: passport, birth certificate, driving licence, residence card, asylum seeker ARC card.
 - For non-UK nationals, as well as ID you will also need to prove your residency status in the UK.
 - If you are an EEA national, you will need to have obtained settled or pre-settled status to be eligible as well.
 - In most cases you will need to have been resident in the UK, EEA or Gibraltar for the last 3 years to be eligible, however there are some exceptions to this rule, e.g. asylum seekers. If you are in any doubt about your eligibility, talk to us and we will check for you.
- · The appropriate fee for your course.
- Evidence of relevant benefits or income if your gross personal income is less than £32,000 per annum (this means that we can offer additional financial support in some cases).
- · Your national insurance number.

Fees and fee exemptions:

Many of our courses that lead to a qualification are free for people on benefits or low incomes. We also have a learning support fund which can provide financial assistance in some cases.

If you are interested in studying with us but are not sure whether you can afford the fee advertised in this magazine, come along to an enrolment session or get in touch to discuss your situation.

Certain courses are free for some people regardless of income – for more details see the sections on individual courses or get in touch with us if you are not sure by ringing 024 7697 5200.

If fees are payable those over £100 can be paid in instalments by direct debit.

INTRODUCTION TO TEACHING ENGLISH TO SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES

Are you looking for a career teaching English as a Second Language? Are you thinking about a TESOL or CELTA course? If you would like to know more before investing in the formal teaching qualifications of TESOL or CELTA this short introductory course is what you are looking for.

Over 8 sessions we will look at:

- An introduction to language awareness
- Approaches to teaching grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation
- Approaches to teaching reading, writing speaking and listening

Different lesson methods

- · Lesson planning and micro-teaching
- Lesson or video observations
- English Language teaching and materials

We offer a range of exciting courses to build confidence, improve health and wellbeing, develop new skills, gain qualifications and equip parents and carers to support their children's learning.

We provide a strong focus on First Step provision to further learning, volunteering combined with a line of sight to work or employment. Programmes of learning include, Family Learning, Study Programme, Courses for People with Learning Disabilities/Difficulties and Community, Accredited and Leisure Programmes.

FAMILY LEARNING

Our Family Learning provision promotes strong, positive relationships within families, enabling parents and carers to support their children's learning and development.

Our vibrant range of programmes are designed specifically for families and provides an excellent opportunity to meet other people with children of a similar age to share ideas and experiences.

There are a variety of programmes for parents/carers of children aged 0-16. Sessions are always free and open to all parents, whatever your experience, or ability. The Family Learning team are all qualified teachers with recent and relevant school experience, each holding a current DBS disclosure.

Our courses are not accredited (so no assessments or exams), and usually last for 2 hours per week, over five or ten weeks. You will get a certificate of completion at the end of a group. We spend time in sessions demonstrating and making inexpensive games to make learning fun and provide free resources for families to use at home with their children.

Family Learning sessions take place in schools, family hubs, and community venues across the city.

Free Family Learning courses and programmes include:

Maths/English in the Primary School (adults

Only) – This course helps parents and carers to understand how these subjects are taught in modern British Primary Schools. You will learn the maths methods, words and activities used in Coventry schools to support your child's learning. You will practice the correct phonics sounds and explore ways to help your child with reading. There is also a focus on the grammar, spelling and handwriting taught in English primary schools. Each week you will be given fun games to take home and play with your children. There is an online pre-recorded version of this course if you cannot attend a face-to-face course.

'I felt really comfortable. The maths was easy to understand. The great games didn't feel like homework at all.' 'The games have helped make phonics fun. I am amazed by how much my son can do!'

Positive Family Foundations (adults only)

- A nurture-based, practical advice programme providing insight on how children interact with their carers and what children need to thrive. This evidence-based approach can help parents / carers cope with challenging behaviour and understand more about children's development. Techniques such as Emotion Coaching are covered to encourage parents to understand how they can calmly and positively influence behaviour. We offer two programmes – one for parents with children aged 0-10 years old, and one for parents with children aged 11 plus. There is an online pre-recorded version of this course if you cannot attend a face-to-face course.

'It was great to listen to other parents. There were lots of ideas on the course - I found the section on Emotion Coaching really helped at home.' **'50 Things to Do Before You're Five'** (adults and their children aged 0-5) - Stay and play sessions for parents and their pre-school aged children which provide resources to encourage understanding of children's learning and development. A range of fun, free and affordable ideas and activities inspired by the '50 Things to Do Before You're Five' app: https://coventry.50thingstodo.org/

Baby Massage – (parents and carers with a baby aged from 6 weeks to 6 months – pre-crawlers) Simple massage techniques to use with your baby while in the group and at home. Baby massage is proven to help to ease your baby's colic pain, stimulate positive brain activity, strengthen attachment and help with sleep patterns of both baby and parents.

'It was lovely, relaxed and a little magical - I felt chilled myself when it had finished.'

COMMUNITY, ACCREDITED AND LEISURE PROGRAMMES

Our Community Programme offers an exciting range of inclusive learning activities for adults. Offering a range of Visual Arts and Performing Arts, Horticultural and sustainability-themed courses to build confidence, improve health and wellbeing, develop new skills or turn creative passions into a business or profession. Courses are offered at a variety of progression levels in 5 or 10-week sessions, offered day and night, during the week and at weekends.



Would you like recognition for your artwork? This term offers more accredited Art and Craft courses. These are intensive 10-week courses where you will be working in a range of mediums in preparation for a final piece.

Courses include Painting & Mixed Media (NCFE Entry Level Award in Creative Craft Entry L1 or Entry L2), and Fabric Crafts (NCFE Entry Level Award in Creative Craft Entry 1). Once we have received your application, the Visual Arts team will contact you to complete the enrolment process, provide advice, guidance and a small assessment.

The Leisure Programme offers competitively priced courses for pleasure. These courses no longer require as much progress and achievement tracking while still developing your skills and knowledge across a range of disciplines.

The Leisure Programme also includes extensive Piano and Music Theory courses. SCHOOL STREET SCHEMES

School Street schemes limit the amount of motor traffic in streets surrounding schools for a short time at the start and end of the school day (8.15-9.15am and 3.15-3.45pm) all year round. From September 4, **Southfields Old School** will fall within one of these areas covering East Street and South Street. Anyone driving on these roads without a valid permit or exemption will be committing an offence and may receive a fixed penalty fine which is currently set at £70.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS



MATHS FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Our courses help you improve your maths and enable you to gain nationally recognised qualifications. The classes are for people who feel they want to start from the basics right up to those preparing for Maths GCSE.

We run both daytime and evening classes at venues throughout the city, as well as online classes. Please note that even if you join an online course, we currently only offer face-to-face enrolments and exams are all paper based, taken at one of our venues. Classes are 2½ hours a week over the school year, aiming at taking exams in the summer term. If you need an exam before this, please speak to someone at enrolment.

Functional Skills Maths study enables you to achieve a nationally recognised qualification, will improve your maths skills and increase your confidence to use these skills in everyday situations. This includes at work, helping your children/grandchildren with

their maths, gaining entry to further/higher education and coping in a modern world where maths skills are essential.

The classes focus on the kind of maths adults need in their everyday lives and include solving calculations, problem solving, using fractions, decimals and percentages, understanding the metric system and interpreting graphs and charts.

Functional Skills Maths qualifications are at 5 different levels from Entry Level 1 (E1) up to Level 2 (L2). You will work towards the most appropriate level, depending on your ability in maths when you start.

Before you are enrolled onto a maths course, you will receive advice and guidance and will be offered an initial assessment which will last around an hour. The assessment is important because it gives you as a learner an idea of what level you will be working at. It will also help you and the tutor make an informed choice about the best class for you.

SHORT MATHS BRUSH-UP CLASSES

If you are thinking about improving your maths but the thought of joining a maths class worries you, we can help! We are running short five-week courses aimed at improving maths confidence. This may lead to joining a Functional Skills class later in the year, but it could just be about building up your skills in a non-pressured environment. You will learn about how to work with everyday maths, from the weekly shop to planning that DIY project you've been putting off!

To book a place at an enrolment session, please go to **coventry.gov.uk/adulted** and click on "Pre-Course Assessments" where you will be able to choose a time that suits you.

All classes will need viable numbers and after enrolments you may be asked to consider moving to a different day/time if your class doesn't have enough enrolments. Managers will aim to meet the needs of all learners.

ENGLISH FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

READING, WRITING, SPEAKING AND LISTENING

If you speak English but need help improving your reading and writing these courses are for you, they will help you improve your skills and at the same time you will gain a nationally recognised qualification. We run both daytime and evening classes at venues throughout the city, as well as online classes. Please note that even if you join an online course, we currently only offer face-to-face enrolments and exams are all paper based, taken at one of our venues. Classes are $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours a week over the year.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS ENGLISH CLASSES

These classes focus on the English skills adults need in their everyday lives, in the workplace, in the community and in your home. There are five different levels from Entry 1 to the highest L2, which is equivalent to grade C or grade 4 at GCSE.

Before you are enrolled onto an English course, you will receive advice & guidance and will be offered an initial assessment which will last around an hour. The assessment is important because it gives you as a learner an idea of what level you will be working at. It will also help you and the tutor make an informed choice about the best class for you.

SHORT ENGLISH COURSES BRUSH UP YOUR ENGLISH

What is this course about?

It is about giving you as the learner some underpinning skills and knowledge around using the correct techniques to write clearly, logically and for the appropriate audience. It will also help with spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What will I learn?

The course is framed around the skills learner's need in the world of work such as how to write letters, emails, articles and reports with the underpinning skills being spelling, writing sentences differentiating when to use formal and informal language and using correct punctuation.

Length of the course:

5 weeks for 2 1/2 hours per week, every half term.

What will this course lead to?

- A Functional Skills Course
- Other Adult Education courses



ENGLISH FOR WORK

What is this course about?

It is about giving you as the learner some underpinning skills and knowledge around using the correct techniques to write clearly, logically and for the appropriate audience. It will also help with spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What will I learn?

The course is framed around the skills learners need in the world of work such as how to write letters, emails, articles and reports you will be given advice and support around how to write CV's, how to complete job applications and how to write personal statements for jobs and you will gain skills around interview techniques.

Length of the course:

5 weeks for 2 1/2 hours per week, every half term from Friday 17 January 2025

GCSE ENGLISH AND MATHS: AOA

We are planning to offer both face-to-face and online GCSE courses. All classes will require you to make a commitment of attending each class and completing up to 5 hours home study per week.

GCSE English includes developing your reading & writing skills and language analysis of 19th, 20th and 21st Century texts. It is a 30-week course with assessment through 2 exams in June. Places for English GCSE *are currently full*, but if you require further information or need the qualification for University.

Prospective GCSE learners should have a minimum of GCSE grade D/3 or Functional Skills level 1 and **must pass a pre-course assessment** before starting the course. If you have been away from education for a while or have no qualifications but are confident in your everyday skills, please talk to us. **Passing the pre-course assessment is the criteria for being offered a place on a course**. We strongly advise that you take **ONE GCSE in an academic year**. However, if you are uncertain which GCSE to apply for, or you have exceptional circumstances, you are welcome to sit both assessments to enable you to make an informed decision.

Attend a Maths & English advice & guidance and assessment session. Please allow 2 hours for each assessment. Please do not bring children. Please bring **photo ID** and **evidence of residency status** (e.g. UK passport, current valid residence permit, valid share code from GOV.uk) with you so we can check if you are eligible for the course. Please also bring any evidence of existing English or maths qualifications if you have them.

Do I need to pay fees?

If you do not have a GCSE in the subject you are applying for at grade 9-4 (A* - C), the course is FREE.

If you do have a GCSE grade 4 (C) or above, and need a higher grade for a specific reason, please talk to Sarah or Matt as it may be possible to apply for funding. If you do not qualify for the support fund the fees are:

DIGITAL FUNCTIONAL SKILLS QUALIFICATION

This course offers you a Qualification at Entry Level 3 and Level 1. It is advisable to enrol onto the Introduction to Digital Functional Skills before enrolling onto the qualification course. This course at both levels covers topics such as:

USING DEVICES AND HANDLING INFORMATION

Manage and store Information and identify and solve simple technical issues.

CREATING AND EDITING

Creating and editing documents, images and other types of digital media.

COMMUNICATING

Gain an understanding of electronic communications. Learning to use email and make video calls.

TRANSACTING

Learn how to complete and submit a form, comply with verification checks and purchase a service or item online.



BEING SAFE AND RESPONSIBLE ONLINE

Gain an understanding of the importance of privacy, data protection and backing up data.
