

Notice of Making

TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS RELATING TO BINLEY CYCLEWAY

Coventry City Council, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), has made the following Orders ("the Orders"), which come into operation on 17th June 2022.

The Orders form part of changes to facilitate and enhance the safety of users of the highway, particularly the Binley Cycleway. Binley Cycleway is a scheme connecting the City Centre with University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire proposed to encourage people to cycle.

The said Orders are: -

i) City of Coventry (Stoke Green & Binley Road) (Prohibition of Driving and Revocation) Order 2022

The effect of this order shall be to prevent vehicles (except pedal cycles) being ridden or driven in any direction on Stoke Green from its western junction with Binley Rd, to a point 7 metres south of its junction with Binley Rd. In addition, it will permit the right turn manoeuvre from Binley Rd into Bulls Head Lane

ii) City of Coventry (Raleigh Road) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 2022

The effect of this order shall be to prevent vehicles (except pedal cycles) being ridden or driven in any direction on Raleigh Road from its junction with Binley Road to a point 2m north of its junction with Binley Road

iii) City of Coventry (Binley Road) (Cycle Lane Revocation) Order 2022

The effect of this order shall be to revoke the cycle lane along Binley Road

A copy of this Notice, the sealed Orders, plan and Statement of Reasons may be inspected on the Council's website.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder, or of any relevant Act, has not been complied with may, within six (6) weeks from today, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
