- Food and drink cans
- Green bottles and jars
- Newspapers and magazines, cereal boxes
- Cardboard - boxes, toilet roll/kitchen roll tubes
- Aluminium foil
- Junk mail, mixed paper and card
- Aerosols
- Drink cartons (sometimes called tetrapaks)
- All household plastic bottles including milk bottles, detergent bottles, toiletry bottles and cleaning product bottles
- All household plastic food trays including fruit or meat trays
- All household food pots including yogurt and dessert pots

No thanks

- Wallpaper
- Lightbulbs
- Broken glass
- Plastic film/plastic bags
- Carrier bags
- Textiles, clothes and bedding
- Polystyrene
- Cookware such as pots and pans and Pyrex
- General rubbish
- Shredded paper
- Plastic plant pots
- Black plastic
- Nappies
- Black bags
- Food waste
