

Hospital Education Service: Fine Art

The students follow the OCR syllabus for Art and Design with the fine Art specialism. GCSE Art and Design helps students develop skills and knowledge and understanding to enable them to express their creativity and imagination through their responses to visual written stimuli.

- Students will explore practical development through workshop led sessions as well as individual project development.
- Students will learn to evaluate and analyse both their own and Artists work and use this written and spoken.
- Unit awards are created to meet the specific needs of the student should they not be able to meet the criteria for GCSE.
- Student's will choose their own themes and project ideas where possible, supported by workshops and tutorials where needed. Student's will have opportunities to work in 2D and 3D ranging from print, textiles, clay, sculpture and paint.
