
10 million bins emptied collecting **105,695 tonnes** of waste

Get ready to have your say

Local and regional elections will be on Thursday 2 May 2024 and to vote in a polling station, you'll need to show a form of photographic ID such as a driving licence or passport.

A full list of accepted ID is at www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voterid. If your photographic ID has expired but it still looks like you, then it will be accepted.

If you haven't got an accepted form of ID, you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) up to 5pm on Wednesday 24 April at www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk or by completing a paper form.
