WORK EXPERIENCE

Students will attend our provision 1 day a week to complete this course. Throughout the duration of the course, students will have the opportunity to gain work experience in the Soft Play area at the AT7 Centre on a weekly basis.

Students will need to plan and prepare mini activities to lead on in the Soft Play area. Students will complete a Work Experience Journal each week, evaluating their progress, alongside completing coursework and exams to pass the modules included in the course.

Work experience will be monitored and supported by North Star staff.

FLOURISH PROGRAMME

My Personal Pathway is an intervention programme to support secondary students with their social, emotional, and behavioural needs. This programme has been designed around research and theory-based practice to ensure that the best educational pathway is identified for individual learners. The course is designed as a termly programme that will focus on learning about ourselves, our development, and strategies to aid regulation in a learning environment. By using a blended approach to learning that incorporates both classroom and practical activities we aim to identify possible reasons for a student's lack of engagement and/or struggles in education.

Where required, with the support from educational psychologists, other professional agencies, and the use of augmented reality and virtual reality technology, this course is a unique and bespoke opportunity to engage students with their learning.

This programme falls into the 'Flourish Category' which is a highly supportive programme (2 days per week), where a student is educated through the use of therapeutic approaches, students' needs and abilities are assessed and supported throughout the programme and comprehensive reports are written, these reports are made accessible to schools and other professionals working with the child, and a full assessment is completed throughout the duration of the course.

This Flourish Pathway Review can be used by schools to initiate or update a 'My Support Plan' for the student which will be provided to the referring school at the end of the placement with recommendations, advisories of support and student development feedback.

This Tier 2 Targeted Programme has been specifically designed to support students who are experiencing high anxiety and this is affecting their attendance and behaviour at school.

My Personal Pathway is our new intervention programme to support secondary students with their social, emotional, and behavioural needs. This programme has been designed around research and theory-based practice to ensure that the best educational pathway is identified for individual learners.

The course is designed as a 12-week programme that will focus on learning about ourselves, our development, and strategies to aid regulation in a learning environment. By using a blended approach to learning that incorporates both classroom-based and practical activities, we aim to identify possible reasons for a student's lack of engagement and/or struggles in education.

With the support from professional agencies, and the use of augmented reality and virtual reality technology, this course is a unique and bespoke opportunity to engage students with their learning.

All activities are carefully planned to promote literacy and numeracy throughout the course. Students needs and abilities are assessed and supported throughout the programme and comprehensive reports are written, these reports are made accessible to schools and other professionals working with the child.

APPLICATIONS

Applications for placements at North Star School follow a thorough procedure to ensure that students are fully supported and their needs are identified.

Coventry

Schools in Coventry should apply through the Coventry Alternative Provision (CAP) pathway. As a procured provider with Coventry Local Authority, CAP ensures that providers meet a set criteria. North Star School works closely with CAP to ensure that a good standard of provision is met for Coventry schools/students. Once an application has been made through CAP, North Star School will contact the school to discuss the application process and aim to start provision for a young person as soon as possible.

Direct

Schools are welcome to make direct referrals to North Star School. Schools wishing to make an application should contact us prior to discuss the student(s) and what we can offer.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Application documentation is received from the referring school / CAP
- 2.A visit to the centre is arranged or a team's meeting is booked in (for online students) for an informal interview to take place, allowing the student to familiarise themselves with our provision and for staff to meet the student. Parents / carers are also encouraged to attend.
- 3. North Star School will review all documentation and discuss any changes with the referring school, parents and carers.
- 4.*CAP students North Star School will complete an Application Response and send to CAP inbox
- 5. If accepting the placement, the student will start provision on the date outlined on the application response (CAP) / date confirmed with referring school, parents and carers
- 6. Student will complete their induction on their first day attending North Star School, induction should include;


At North Star School, we set out our expectations within our Student Induction and Policies. These include, but are not limited to;


MEET DEXTER
