The first step for any school interested in becoming a School of Sanctuary is to <u>sign the supporting organisation</u> <u>pledge</u>. We advise that a school takes at least a whole school year after this point before submitting an application.

		Accreditation Timeline	
S	Step 1	 Express interest in Schools of Sanctuary accreditation to Coventry EMAS local leads (Michelle & Amanda) Secure commitment and support from SLT and governors towards becoming a SOS. Make your pledge <u>City of Sanctuary organisational pledge</u>. Register for SOS newsletter, follow on social media. Complete audit of existing provision - review what your school already has in place or has done to date to meet the award criteria (Learn, Embed, Share) using the <u>Schools of Sanctuary</u> <u>self-assessment tool</u> to help you reflect on relevant areas of practice. 	
Suggested timeline = one year	Step 2	 Create a School of Sanctuary Action Plan using the <u>resource</u> <u>pack</u>, <u>website</u> and <u>Padlet</u> for inspiration, with support from local leads. This should include evidence of sanctuary-seeker experience and forced migration within different areas of the school's curriculum i.e. different subjects, year groups, activities. Plan how you will mark Refugee Week and other key campaigns. Sign up to local and national SOS networking and CPD events Make links with local sanctuary seeking organisations e.g. CRMC, Carriers of Hope and non-sanctuary seeking organisations e.g. churches, libraries, theatres to share message of welcome. 	
Suggest	Step 3	 Complete and submit draft application to local lead, evidencing the 8 minimum criteria (LEARN, EMBED, SHARE). Use <u>the application guide</u> to help you and have a look at the examples applications <u>example applications</u>. Your application will be reviewed by local leads and feedback given. School responds to feedback – provide additional evidence as needed. 	
	Step 4	 Final application and portfolio of evidence submitted to SOS local leads and sanctuary appraisal panel. Sanctuary appraisal panel to meet and assess application. School visit – opportunity for assessors to meet with pupils, teachers, leadership and parents. Feedback given to schools. Schools of Sanctuary status is awarded - presentation and celebration event. Share your news far and wide. 	
	Step 5	After 3 years renew your pledge and status as a SOS.
