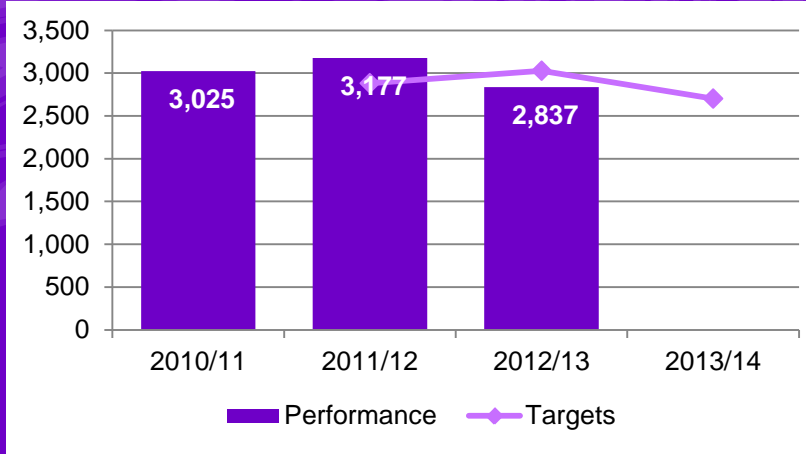

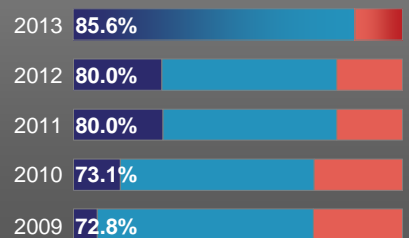

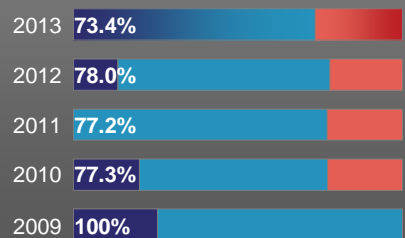

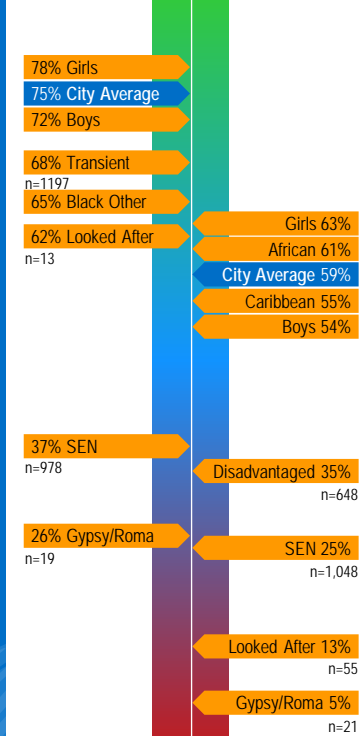

Residents who are economically deprived, young adults, black people, or living in social housing are least likely to eat the recommended five portions of fruit & vegetables every day.

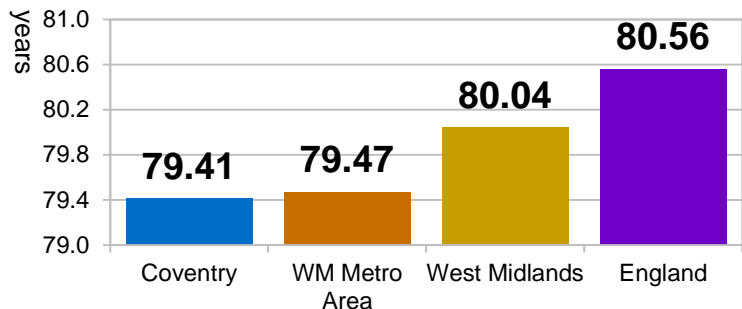
physical activity

44% said they took part in some form of physical activity five or more times a week – unchanged from September 2012 (43%).

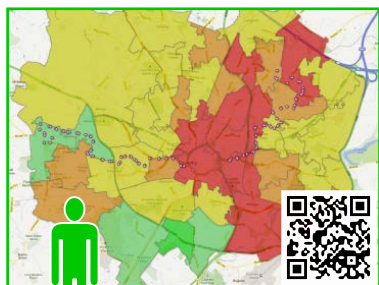
Did you know...

Residents who are male, aged 65 or over, Asian or full-time employed are least likely to take part in physical activity.

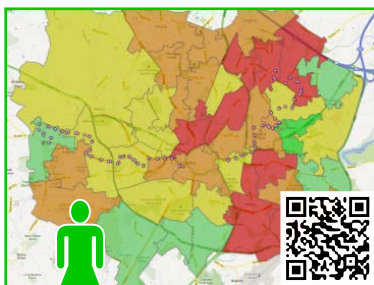
On average, people in Coventry have a shorter life expectancy...

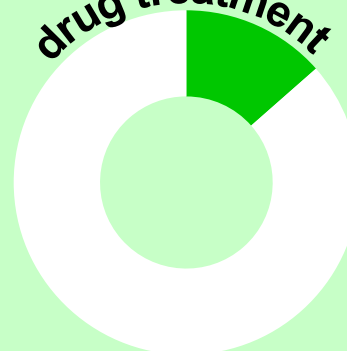

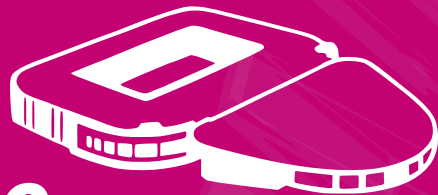

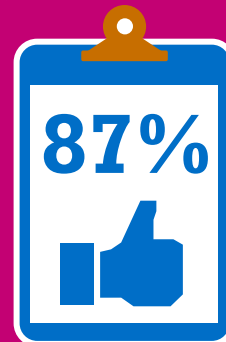


Olympic football

424 attendees completed a survey, and the vast majority rated the event good or excellent.

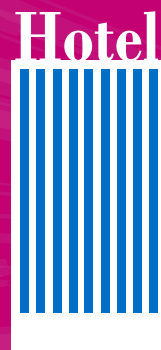

95 businesses in the sub-region won Olympic-related contracts worth over **£30 million**.



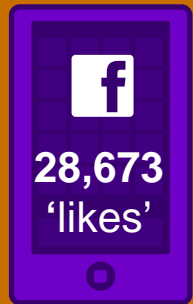
21 of these were in Coventry and, most notably, included making the **8,000** Olympic torches.

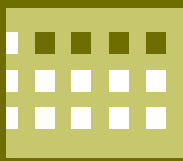
